- The Lee-Davis girls softball team was the VHSL 5A State Runner-up. The girls were Conference 11 champions as well as the VHSL 5A South Region champions before losing 1-0 in the state finals. The Boys Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field teams were the VHSL 5A State Runner-up and VHSL 5A South Region champions. Wrestling team was Conference 11 and VHSL 5A South champions.
- We are proud that the average GPA for our student-athletes is 3.44.
- Our graduates earned nearly \$1 million in scholarships and grants to be used toward post-secondary education thanks in large part to our Hanover Education Foundation and the multiple community organizations that support our school and our students.
